### **Bartley Terrace Resurfacing Works And Lack Of Lighting**

Thank you for your email dated August 9, 2017, sent on behalf of residents in the West Lakes, West Lakes Shore & Semaphore area regarding the resurfacing works on Bartley Terrace and the new roundabout at the intersection of Bartley Terrace & Greenfield Crescent.

The Bartley Terrace Streetscape Project was consulted in the 2015/2016 financial year, including workshops and open days, to enable members of the public to provide input into the outcome of the project. The community identified a desire to 'calm' traffic in front of the shops between Fairford Terrace and Greenfield Crescent, and to improve pedestrian connectivity between the shops and the footbridge opposite. As a result of the community feedback, the current concept includes at least one Zebra Crossing on Bartley Terrace in the section of road between Greenfield Crescent and Fairford Terrace.

The DPTI Operation Instruction for the use of on-street Zebra Crossings requires that a low speed environment in the order of 30km/h or less is achieved on each approach to a crossing. On this basis roundabouts were proposed at the Bartley Terrace/Fairford Terrace and Bartley Terrace/Greenfield Crescent intersections to facilitate this low speed environment. It is proposed to construct the additional roundabout and Zebra Crossing/s as part of a future stage of the streetscape upgrade (Stage 2).

Once consultation was completed, a report was endorsed by Council and a budget approved for its construction in the 2016/2017 financial year for the first stage of the project.

The project commenced with the section between Bower Road and Greenfield Crescent (Stage 1). As part of this project, there were a number of changes to the road and surrounding area, including pavement deep lift, footpath replacement, kerb and gutter renewal, traffic calming measures, public lighting improvements and the inclusion of a new Shared Use path.

Unfortunately, once the construction works had commenced, we were notified of forthcoming gas main replacement works by APA Utilities along the length of Bartley Terrace. Once notification was received, it was decided that some of the Council works would be deferred until after the APA gas main replacement had been completed. This included line marking,



installation of a central median and final seal. By deferring these works, it ensured a better final product and minimised disruption for the duration of the APA works.

As the final seal has been deferred, the top stones are higher than current road level and have required chamfering to make safe. As such, it is acknowledged that the current road surface is not an optimal surface for travel. Whilst this is undesirable from a user perspective, the speed limit has been lowered temporarily to improve driver experience.

As for the lighting of the roundabout, our lighting contractor unfortunately experienced major plant failure towards the end of last financial year which delayed a number of projects across the City. I can confirm that there will be additional lighting installed at the roundabout, as well as an upgrade of the luminaires along Bartley Terrace as each stage of the project is completed. All materials have been procured for the first stage and we are currently awaiting confirmation from the contractor on the date for installation. Depending on the timing of these works, we will review the current condition of the roundabout and see if any intermediate measures are required.

For your information, construction of Stage 2 of the Bartley Terrace Streetscape Project (Greenfield Crescent to Fairford Terrace) will be submitted for budget approval in 2018/2019, postponed from this current year due to the APA works.
